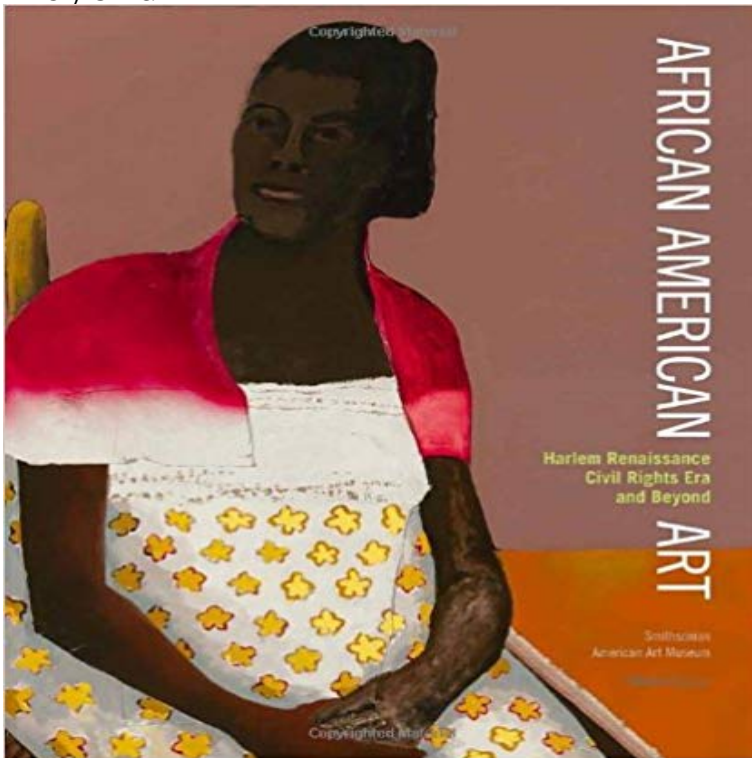


# African American Art: Harlem Renaissance, The Civil Rights Era, and Beyond

Drawn entirely from the Smithsonian American Art Museums rich collection of African American art, the works include paintings by Benny Andrews, Jacob Lawrence, Thornton Dial Sr., Romare Bearden, Alma Thomas, and Lois Mailou Jones, and photographs by Roy DeCarava, Gordon Parks, Roland Freeman, Marilyn Nance, and James Van Der Zee. More than half of the artworks in the exhibition are being shown for the first time. In Richard Powells text, his usual keen insights into meaning and metaphor enrich the readers understanding of the artworks in their historical setting and contemporary culture.
