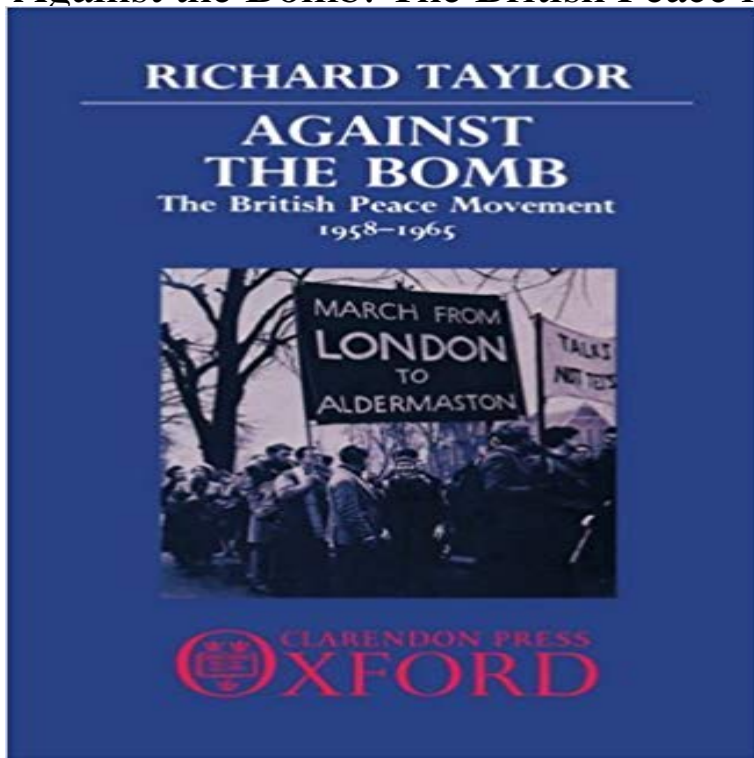


Against the Bomb: The British Peace Movement 1958-1965
