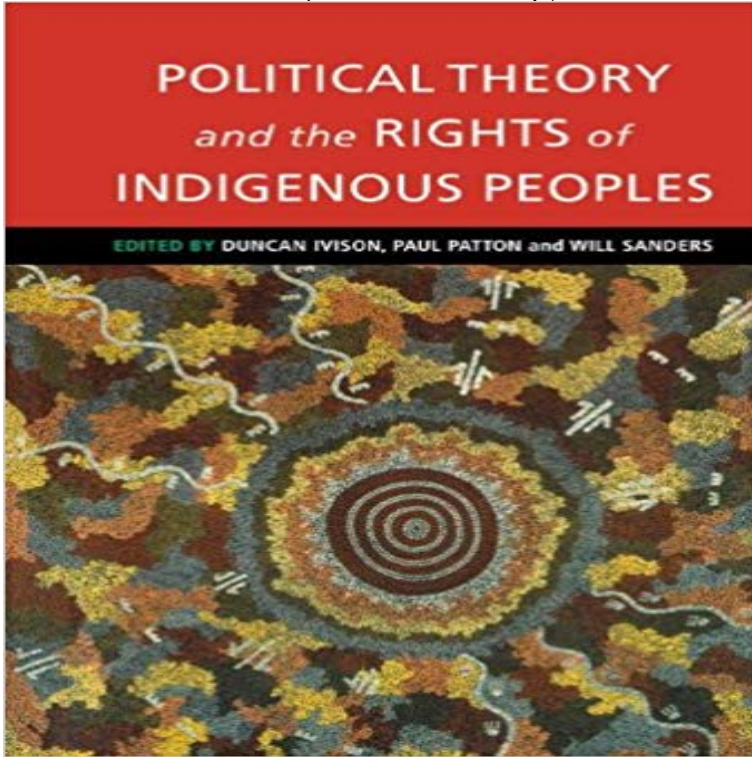


Political Theory and the Rights of Indigenous Peoples
