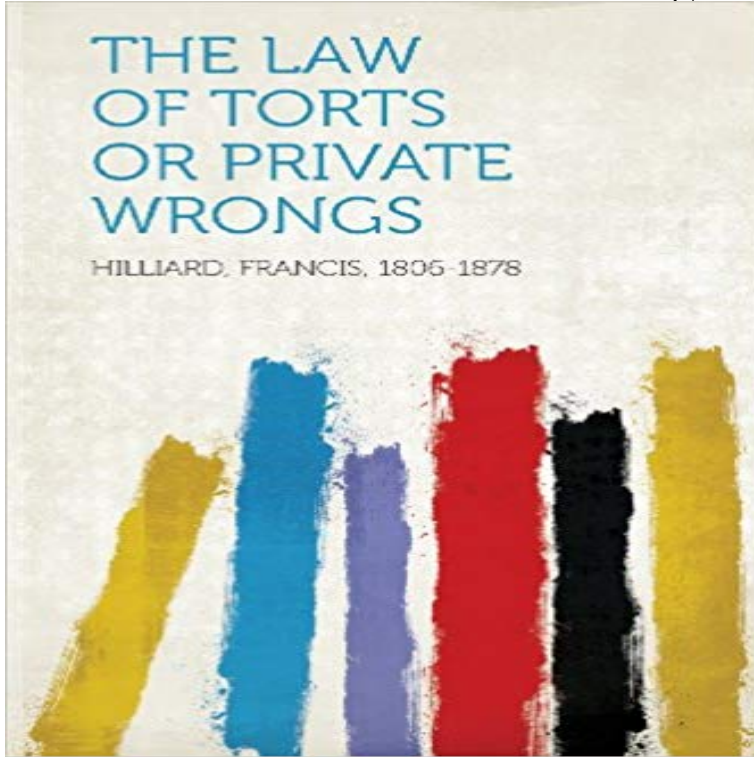


The Law of Torts or Private Wrongs
