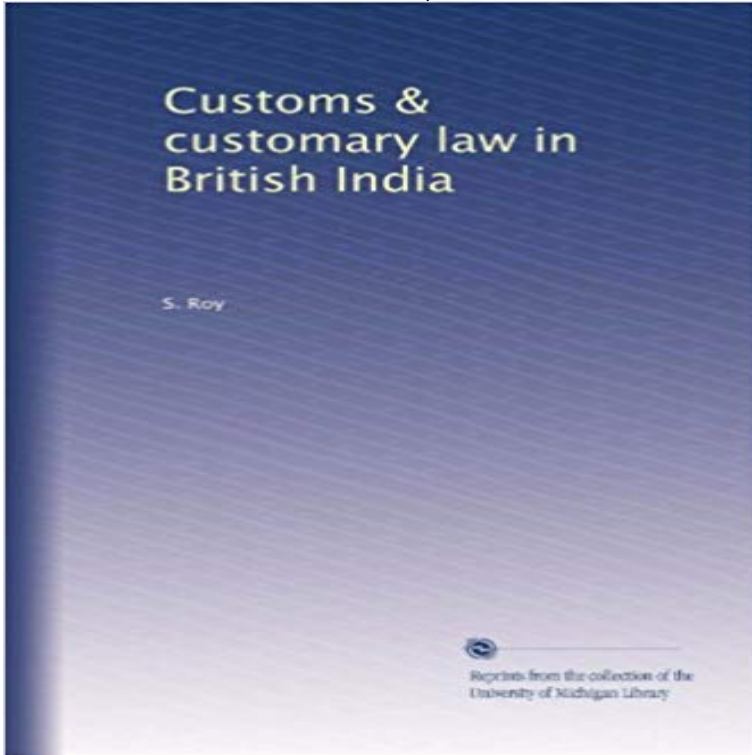


# Customs & customary law in British India
